

Blessing of the Cars ~ St. Christopher's Day Will Take Place Here – AFTER LORD's Day Masses JULY 29 & 30 – 5PM / 9 AM and 11 AM

St. Christopher is the patron saint of travelers and of children. He is one of the most popular Saints of the East and West. There are many legends concerning this Saint. One of the most popular of them holds that St. Christopher was a giant who helped people across a raging stream. It is believed that he carried the Christ Child across this same stream. Hence, his name Christopher, Christ-bearer. He is Patron of motorists, and is invoked against storms, plagues, etc. He died a Martyr during the reign of Decius in the 3rd century and is one of the Fourteen Holy Helpers invoked for emergencies or afflictions. WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY (Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time)

For children born in 1923, and who lived on farms up the Gatineau, their grandparents would have been born around 1875. Money was rarely seen. The land provided feed for the cattle. There were hogs used for meat, and chickens for eggs. Families were large, and there was room on neighbouring farms where Home Children lived. The main house was where the family lived, without electricity. Water came from a dug well.

Out back in the farm yard would be a weather-beaten barn board building, more or less a shed. It had windows. In it is where the grandparents lived. Their grandchildren would drop in every now and then and there wasn't much, but there was always at least a tea biscuit baked in the wood stove to sit down to. The sun would shine in through the rough-hewn windows.

There was no awareness of a lack of anything, because there wasn't. Everyone was used to it. If anything went wrong, someone always told someone else, and it was taken care of one way or another.

For a senior citizen now, they would know their parents' stories, their grandparents' stories, and have heard stories about their great-grand parents. They would know their own stories, that of their children, and the stories of their children's children. That's six generations.

Being a grandparent, is to be right in the middle of it all. Being elderly is to be someone who is held so dear by a grandparent because they know their past.

Taking a trip to Upper Canada Village is fun, but it isn't quiet the way it was on the farm. When news arrived, it was news well past, but that meant that the past was brought into the present, and even though others might have been on the far side of the ocean never to be in touch again, it was as if they were right there, then, and now.
