In The Catholic Church, a Mass intention is a specific request or petition for which a priest celebrates the Mass, offering the graces of the Eucharist for a particular person or need. It's essentially a way of applying the power of the Mass to a specific intention, whether it's for the living or deceased. A Mass intention cannot be for both the living and the deceased at the same time.

Here's a more detailed explanation:

Why Offer Mass Intentions?

For the Living: Mass intentions can be offered for healing, thanksgiving, birthdays, anniversaries, or any other special needs or requests.

For the Deceased: Mass intentions are a common practice for the deceased, often offered for their repose in purgatory, with the belief that the graces of the Mass can help them on their journey to heaven.

To Intercede for Others: Mass intentions allow individuals and the Church to intercede for others through the power of the Eucharist.

How Mass Intentions Work:

Priest's Intention: When a priest celebrates Mass, he typically has a specific intention attached to that particular Mass, often a Mass intention requested by someone.

Offering of Graces: The priest then offers the Mass, and the graces of the Eucharist are specifically applied to that

intention, whether for the individual or for the larger spiritual needs of the Church.

Private Intentions: Individuals can also bring their own personal intentions to Mass, which they may offer privately during the celebration.

Gratitude and Appreciation: While offering a stipend (donation) for a Mass intention is common, it's not a fee for the Mass itself, but rather a way of contributing to the upkeep of the church and clergy.

Ancient Tradition: The practice of offering Mass for specific intentions has roots in the early Church, dating back to the second century.

Mass intentions draw us to the Eucharist as the "source and summit" of Christian life, to graces beyond personal prayer. If only one intention is within a Mass, the spiritual grace is not divided. The grace is divided when there is more than one intention at a Mass. A Mass intention has the same value whether celebrated on Sunday or during the week.

On Palm Sunday, April 13, the Vatican's Dicastery for the Clergy issued a decree, approved by Pope Francis, revising norms governing the discipline of Mass intentions.

The new norms say that while the Faithful can continue to offer stipends for Masses to be celebrated according to specific intentions, the sacred tradition must remain free of any outward appearance of commercial exchange.

It permits "collective intentions" – a practice where multiple offerings are united in a single Mass – only under strict conditions. These conditions are that when an intention is requested, the faithful must be explicitly informed and must freely consent to their intention being included in multiple offerings within a single Mass, (according to Vatican News). This new decree replaces the 1991 instruction, which affirms that priests may receive offerings for celebrating Mass according to specific intentions, while introducing significant provisions for "collective intentions" as stated in Canon 945 of the Code of Canon Law.

These new norms went into effect on Easter Sunday, April 20.

They also prohibit any substitution of promised Masses with simple mentions during liturgies, categorizing such practices as gravely illicit. Emphasizing justice to the Faithful and the avoidance of simony (the act of buying or selling church offices or sacred things), the Dicastery calls for vigilance from bishops. The Vatican is instructing bishops to catechize the faithful, monitor implementation, and ensure accurate record-keeping of intentions and offerings.

Gregorian Masses: Gregorian Masses for the deceased (30 consecutive days).

A priest offering a Gregorian Mass must have, as his principal intention, only the benefit of one soul in Purgatory. (i.e., a series of Gregorian Masses cannot be, strictly speaking, divided for the benefit of two or more souls.) The exception is a married couple because they are one body. (It is also possible to request 30 consecutive Mass offerings for two or more souls together, but this arrangement does not fall within the strict definition of 'Gregorian Masses'.)

A Mass may be applied for anyone, living or deceased, baptized or non-baptized, sinner or saint. (If the soul is in heaven, the Masses offered benefit souls in purgatory.)

Within the obligations of a pastor, it would not be possible they commit to the offering of a Gregorian Mass. If it is agreeable, a Gregorian Mass can be sent to a seminary where there are priests able to make the commitment to the thirty consecutive days a Gregorian Mass is to be celebrated.
