

Worrying about the Future – Looking back

(Luke 9.11b-17)

The Disciples were busy worrying about the future and how to provide. And they were doing it while having Jesus beside them. There's no doubt his ways weren't universally approved of. It's talked about often in Scripture. And the things that were of benefit to so many others often went to his detriment. The Apostles didn't want to be in a situation of responsibility and failure, so they said,

"Send the crowd away, so that they may go into the surrounding villages and countryside, to lodge and get provisions; for we are here in a deserted place." (Luke 9:12)

Jesus simply didn't listen to it. He said to his disciples,

"Make the people sit down in groups of about fifty each." They did so and made them all sit down. And taking the five loaves and the two fish, He looked up to heaven and blessed and broke them, and gave them to the disciples to set before the crowd. And all ate and were filled. What was left over was gathered up, twelve baskets of broken pieces. (Luke 14-17)

It doesn't say that Jesus looked back trying to smooth things over after how they went. He took care of what needed to be taken care of.

Important Reminder to Pastors from the Archbishop (Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist) (Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist for the Sick)

Following a regrettable incident, I would like to remind you of some key guidelines concerning Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist.

These individuals play a vital role in our celebrations by assisting in the distribution of Holy Communion. To fulfill this responsibility, they must demonstrate exemplary conduct, be well-regarded in the community, and treat everyone with respect.

Please ensure that those chosen for this ministry are suitable and trustworthy. Certain behaviours must be strictly avoided. A lay minister should never be alone with a child or a vulnerable person without the presence of a parent or guardian. Even well-meaning gestures can sometimes be misinterpreted and raise concerns for families [EPIC checks are asked for].

If you observe that a minister does not meet these standards or does not reflect Catholic values, please do not hesitate to remove them from this role.

In addition, if you witness any inappropriate behaviour, it is your responsibility to report it immediately to the Safe Environment Office at the Diocesan Centre. This office plays a crucial role in ensuring the safety of everyone within our Archdiocese. Any concerns must be reported without delay. [Final registration of an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist belongs to the Pastor and only the Pastor can nominate them.]

Thank you for your attention to this matter and for your ongoing commitment to making this ministry a respectful and safe service for all.
